
FLOODS 2010:

**Damage Assessment,
Emergency Relief and
Rehabilitation Efforts**

NRSP Update as of December 6, 2010

Briefing of events

Since July 21, 2010, Pakistan has been experiencing heavy flash floods primarily affecting Southern Punjab, Khyber Pakhtoonkhwa (KpK) being the worst hit district. Muzaffarabad and Neelum in AJK, and Baluchistan have also been badly affected. Flood water entered in Sindh Province on August 05, 2010 and has brought havoc there too.

Besides with irreversible human casualties, the flood affected communities have witnessed huge losses to the crops, bridges, roads, infrastructures and health facilities. The disrupted communication systems are also restricting movement resulting in further fatalities. Hampered communication networks have led to inaccurate reporting of the full scale of the disaster and the long-term implications for food security resulting from the losses in crops have yet to be determined.

The latest Government estimates suggest that over 14 million people have been affected by the flash floods. The scale of the damage is still expanding as water is heading down to the Sindh Province. The low lying areas of Sindh along the banks of Indus River are at high risk.

According to National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), the death toll has risen to 1,802 with 2,994 persons injured. Cumulatively around one million households have been damaged completely across Pakistan. The losses are likely to keep on mounding as the time passes and floods passes through the Sindh province. A breakdown of these losses by province is provided in Table 1.

NRSP'S Rapid Assessment of the Flood Damages through PRA

The NRSP is present in almost all flood affected Districts of Khyber Pakhtoonkhawa, Punjab and Azad Kashmir. As such, the NRSP has been able to conduct a rapid assessment of flood damages. To complete this assessment, the organisation capitalised on its network of Community Organisations and activists to facilitate information collection providing a fuller and up to date overview of the scale of the disaster, and the location of those affected. This assessment has informed the NRSP's relief efforts to date. In the 470 UCs surveyed, 526,562 households were found to be severely affected by the floods.

NRSP activities - emergency relief

The NRSP has existing office infrastructure in almost all affected districts alongside its network of grassroots level community organisations and activists. This has enabled the NRSP to respond in both central and more remote areas.

Core initiatives are:

- § *Search and rescue operations* in the worst hit communities: To date the organisation has moved over 4,867 persons to safer locations.
- § *Human resources and vehicles*. All staff and vehicles have been reassigned to emergency rescue and rapid assessment activities.
- § *Funding*. The NRSP allocated Rs. 5 Million in the first 24 hours of the floods enabling regional and District Offices to begin distributing emergency provisions.
- § *Local Support Network*: The NRSP engaged community activists, community organisations and its Union Council level federations (Local Support Organizations) to strengthen emergency relief operations.
- § *Rapid Response Unit*. This has been established at Head Office to coordinate the relief work of its regional and district offices. The unit is also lobbying with

national and international stakeholders and funding agencies to pool resources to scale up its emergency relief operations.

- § *The provision of shelter:* Through Shelter Box Trust UK, the NRSP arranged and distributed 3,419 Shelter Boxes and 35,022 tents in affected districts.
- § *NRSP Food Programme:* NRSP is running a food programme through world Food Programme for over 170,000 households across Pakistan. The food package provides uncooked food for a period of three months.
- § *Coordination with Public and Private Sector Stakeholders:* NRSP's District and Regional Offices are closely coordinating with the national and provincial Disaster Management Authorities. In many areas, NRSP's District Offices are serving as emergency relief hubs.
- § *Facilitation:* The NRSP is facilitating other national and international humanitarian aid agencies to access affected communities through its network of community organisations, LSOs and offices.

As of December 6, 2010, through its emergency rescue and relief operations, the NRSP has assisted 807,538 households in the flood affected districts. A summary of these activities is given in Table 3.

Contribution of NRSP Fostered Local Support Organizations in Emergency Relief

The NRSP's countrywide network of LSOs has been highly proactive in emergency relief efforts. Being native to the area and having strong social networks at local level, these LSOs have proved to be the most efficient and effective hand for emergency relief. They not only pooled local level resources and accessed to tens of thousands of affected households, they also strengthened NRSP's relief operations by volunteering their services.

As of now, 98 LSOs across Pakistan participated in the relief operations and were able to reach some 354,214 households with a variety of relief activities. They provided food, medical assistance, clothing, livestock care, non-food items and emergency livelihoods support. In addition, these LSOs have generously responded to NRSP's appeal for cash donations in the Flood Relief Bank accounts that NRSP has opened. Cumulatively, these LSOs have collected and donated Rs.853,000 as cash to strengthen NRSP's emergency relief operations.

The region and district wise details of the LSO contribution in emergency relief are given in Table 4 below.

The NRSP's future strategy for emergency relief and rehabilitation

The NRSP strategy is focused on three core areas: *rescue & recovery*, *the provision of relief*, and *rehabilitation*. To facilitate these operations, the organisation plans to set up a stockpile at its warehouses in Islamabad, Bahawalpur, AJK and Turbat. This stockpile will include Emergency Response Tool Kits and search and rescue equipment.

Emergency Response Unit

The NRSP has established an Emergency Response Unit to facilitate NRSP Emergency Relief operations countrywide.

Relief Goods Delivery Status as of December 6, 2010

As soon as this disaster took place, NRSP started its relief activities all over Pakistan. NRSP is providing all kind of relief goods to flood affectees through its own sources as well as through national and international Humanitarian Aid agencies. The major share is that of WFP, Diakonie, USAID and Shelter Box. WFP is supporting around 100,000 families in 12 flood affected districts through provision of food items; Diakonie is supporting 10,000 families in KpK through provision of food items, Hygiene kits, Shelter and water; and USAID is supporting 49,600 families in five flood affected Districts (three in Punjab and two in Sindh) through partnership with NRSP's.

A summary of the goods provided by NRSP in all flood affected districts is given in Table 5 below.

NRSP's Emergency Relief through National and International Humanitarian Aid Agencies

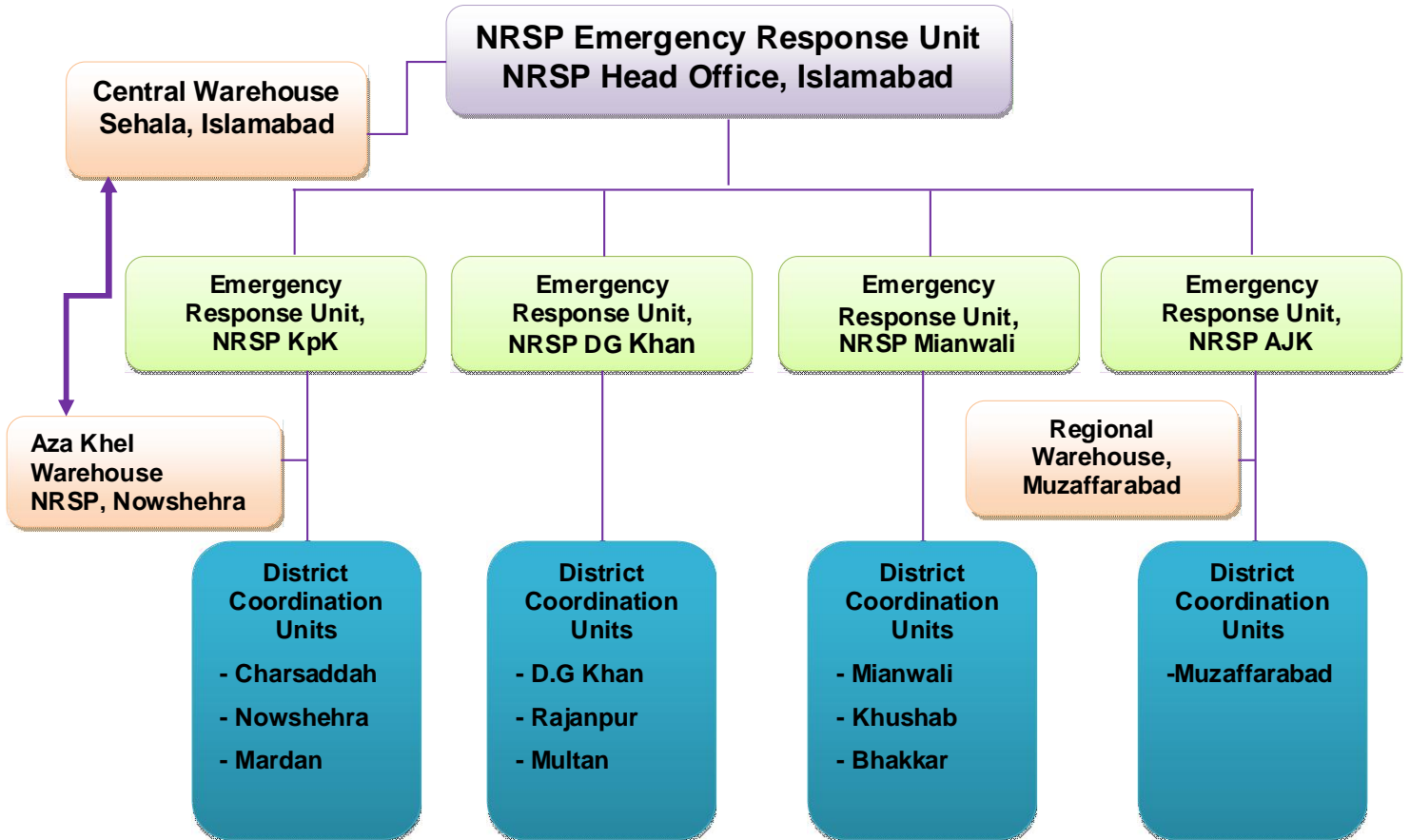
