Background

The World Bank required the services of a qualified consulting firm for the implementation of a project (hereinafter called the El Nino Project) for supporting small farmers to adapt to the changes of El Nino on Agriculture Sector in Sindh. The project is funded through a grant provided by the Food Price Crisis Response Trust Fund. Having excellent social mobilization outreach and experience in execution of verity of developmental interventions including but not limited to improvement in the livelihoods, natural resource management, skills enhancement and awareness raising etc; World Bank in early 2016 invited National Rural Support Programme (NRSP) as single source funding to submitted a concept note the proposed intervention. Later on, in early January, 2017 World Bank asked for a detailed proposal on the said concept which it intends to execute immediately. This proposal elaborates the project scope, objective, expected results, activities, overall methodology for execution of project, log frame, work plan, budget and other important aspects.

Following is the brief overview of the Project:

Project Title: Supporting small farmers to adapt to the changes of EL Nino on Agriculture sector in Sindh (El Nino world bank project)

Project Location: Sindh: 4 Union Councils of districts Mirpukhas district

UCs: Kak, Chitori, Kaeero & Doultpur

Project Objective: To build the capacity of small farmers in district Mirpurkhas to prepare for and adapt to the impact of El Nino on agricultural sector

Project Components: Project Components:

Component 1:

Climate Vulnerability and El Nino preparedness assessment study in four Union Councils: The assessment will capture the required information and data including but not limited to the existing agricultural practices, local knowledge and practice about climate change affects and coping strategies. The study will feed into the overall district level Disaster Risk Management plan under the Sindh Resilience Project (SRP).

Component 2:

Awareness raising and preparation of climate smart agriculture plan at village and UC levels: Develop climate smart agriculture plans at farm (on needs basis), village and union council levels through a participatory process. Formulate and Strengthen Joint Development Committee for coordination, oversight and implementation support to smart agriculture plans. Linked Joint Development Committees to the Sindh Resilience Project (SRP) of the government. The climate smart agriculture plan will also be informed by and/or serve as a potential input to the district-level DRM plan for Mirpurkhas under SRP.

Component 3:

Capacity building of farmers in improved agricultural practices: It would include interactive sessions, field training, expert advice for climate-smart, mitigating and adaptive agricultural practices for Kharif and Rabi crops.

Component 4: Facilitating/linking farmers' to existing microfinance organizations: Facilitate/link farmers to existing microfinance organizations for micro loans for improved agricultural practices, hybrid seeds, water use efficiency tools to mitigate the adverse impacts of El-Nino and to reduce their overall vulnerability.

Gender is a cross cutting theme. In all project activities, women's participation will be ensured through engaging women community institutions that have at least 50% female representation, and they will encouraged to participate in all training activities under the project.

A selection committee from NRSP will evaluate the proposals and assign a rating to each proposal (technical and financial) according to a above set of criteria. The ratings of the individual committee members are weighted and a final score is assigned to each proposal. To qualify technically a minimum of 70% score is needed. Financial proposal of only those firms will be opened whose proposals are technically qualified. Method will be used QCBS (Quality and Cost Based Selection) with 80% weight to technical and 20% weight to financial. The proposal with the highest score will be selected and the Consultant will be contacted for contract award and signature. This process should normally take about 10 to 15 days.

Annexure-2: Suggested Evaluation Study Format

NRSP will be happy to receive suggestions for report formats from interested parties, but would expect the final evaluation report to cover the following:

- 1) Title page
- 2) Contents page
- 3) List of abbreviations and acronyms
- 4) Executive Summary (maximum 2 pages, clearly summarizing the assessment and key findings; reflecting the objectives, results and indicators)
- 5) Background (maximum 4 pages on the context of the intervention, project objectives and evaluation exercise; basic details of project can be shared with the consultant/firm)
- 6) Methodology (maximum 4 pages detailing what data was collected, how it was collected and by whom, what the sample size was, what were tools used, highlight on quantitative and qualitative collection of data, different approaches used, any possible limitations to the assessment etc)
- 7) Findings and analysis (maximum 60 pages giving the results of the assessment according to the objectives given in this ToRs, combining qualitative and quantitative data, disaggregated by sex and age. The Findings section should also include a summary table showing updated information for project log frame indicators and project's expected results)
- Recommendations/Suggestions (maximum 3 pages, recommendations and suggestions must be clearly related to the evidence given in the findings section and project indicators)
- 9) Annexes: These might include:
 - a. Itinerary/schedule
 - b. List of people and organizations consulted
 - c. References / list of documents reviewed
 - d. Examples of all data collection tools used (e.g. questionnaires/formats, semistructured interview questions)
